


FRIDAY, JANUARY 14

WASSAW ISLAND NWR

Leader: Capt. John Crawford, 8:00 AM – 4:30 PM, Minimum 15, Maximum 30. Cost \$45.00 per person, includes lunch. Note: We'll be carpooling from the hotel on Tybee Island to the dock on Skidaway Island.

Explore one of the most pristine barrier islands along the eastern seaboard. Bring raingear, water, hat, waterproof hiking shoes or boots, layers of clothes, and spotting scope. You'll spend much of this trip on a beach, but will also visit maritime forest habitat. Target species: Shorebirds, gulls, terns, and marsh sparrows. Moderate, with considerable walking on the beach.

1) Travel to the island on Friday January 14, 2011 via ferry.

2) Dinner on the island on Friday.

3) Lodging in either a two person cottage (two twin beds with private bath), or a full-sized bedroom with private bath in one of three newly built staff houses.

4) Breakfast Saturday morning followed by a guided trip by David Sibley. This field trip will also touch on island history, including the site of a 16th century Spanish Mission, 18th century historic home (said to have been owned by Button Gwinnett), and 19th century tabby slave cabins. Picnic lunch provided.5) Return to the mainland on Saturday January 15, 2011 by 3:00pm.
