

## Meeting description taken verbatim from Earle Greene's A Lifetime with the Birds An Ornithological Logbook<sup>1</sup>

## April 3-4, 1937 Georgia State College for Women – Milledgeville, Georgia

On April 3 and 4 the First Biennial Meeting of the Georgia Ornithological Society was held at the Georgia State College for Women in Milledgeville and I was glad to attend this inspiring gathering. It was in Milledgeville that Dr. Frank M. Chapman, at the age of eight, began his study of birds. Our meeting was successful in many ways with an attendance of more than eighty people. The Biological Survey was represented by Thomas D. Burleigh, Harold Peters and Earle R. Greene. By-laws were adopted, providing for additions to the staff of officers. In the official organ of the society, "The Oriole", issue of June 1937, the Charter Membership was printed, Miss Berma Jarrard being Treasurer.
