Editorial Comment

This has been an interesting quarter, bird-wise. Editors of local newsletters were divided on the migration. Most said the migration was off or rather poor. A few said it seemed normal or a bit above normal. Here in Northwest Georgia, the migration didn't amount to much. Birds came through in trickles; but there were only a few wave days.

Arctic terns were reported off the coast of Brunswick. As are the other sightings in this newsletter, this is undocumented.

Other sightings of interest were possible sightings of Warbling Vireos at Dalton and Cloudland Canyon State Park. House Finches were reported to be feeding young at Dalton. Here again, the observers are good "yard" birders; but lack a lot in the experience line. My feeling is that they did see House Finches feeding young. A light phase Rough-legged Hawk was spotted at Hiwassee.

It's very rewarding to see the numbers of birds of prey reported that cross my desk. Especially those of Bald Eagles. When I first started editing the bird news six years ago, I seldom had any eagle reports. Now they're coming across in numbers. Golden Eagle reports came in from Cloudland and the Eufaula National Wildlife Refuge. A sighting of a Peregrine Falcon was turned in from Brasstown Bald.

Sandhill Crane sightings came in as expected from the Okefenokee National Wildlife Refuge, Atlanta, and Northwest Georgia. American White Pelicans were at the Eufaula National Wildlife Refuge: Common Loons were fairly common over the state; Glossy Ibis were reported from Augusta and Harris Neck National Wildlife Refuge. A Little Tern was spotted at Augusta. Greater Scaup were reported from down around Atlanta way.

Round-up of GOS News

Thank you Augusta Audubon Society for a great Spring meeting! Eighty-Seven people were registered; 124 species of birds were listed.

The Friday evening bird slide narrative presented by Anne and Vernon Waters gave us a sneak preview of the birds and good birding habitat we would encounter on the field trips. The photography was excellent and Vernon's lively delivery made for a successful presentation.

Doris Mager the Eagle lady of Florida, gave the banquet speech. She told of her many and varied experiences in rehabilitating birds of prey back to the wild. Bringing life to her lecture were a Great Horned Owl and a Golden Eagle. If you missed the Augusta meeting, you missed a good one -- it was a smooth-running, well-planned meeting.

Between Meetings Field Trips

Joint GOS - Atlanta Audubon Pelagic Trip. September 4th, 1982.

Yes, there has been a successful Georgia pelagic trip. On the last Saturday of August last year a group of AAS birders got 55+ Audubons Shearwaters, 45 Cory's Shearwaters, Wilson's Petrels, Bridled Terns, a Parasitic Jaeger and a white tailed Tropicbird - all about 65 miles out.

And we can't wait to go again - the first Saturday of September this year! We've chartered the 72 ft. Island Queen for this joint GOS/AAS venture. We'll leave the Jekyll Island marina at 12:00 A.M. and return around midnight in order to maximize time to look for those lifers and/or state records. We'll head for where the birds are - the Gulf Stream (60 - 75 miles out) and beyond (100 miles out).

Sunday, September 19, U. S. Forest Service Forestry Technician Harriett DiGioia - will be leading the Cherokee Audubon Society on a field trip to the Songbird Management Area. GOSers are cordially invited. Meet at 9:30 A.M. at TP's Country Store.

This management area, a pilot non-game management area, is located at the Lake Conasauga Recreation Area on the Cohutta Ranger District of the Chattahoochee National Forest. The third week in September is prime for warblers, vireos, tanagers, thrushes - this area is located on the Appalachian Flyway for these birds.

Directions to TP's Country Store - take the Chatsworth Highway 411 N exit off I-75 at Cartersville, Georgia, to Eton, next town north of Chatsworth at only traffic light in Eton, turn right and proceed to TP's Country Store, sitting in the middle of a "Y" in the road.
