NONGAME BILL - HANGING IN

Early in January 1984, for the third consecutive legislative session, the Georgia General Assembly will consider a special funding to protect Georgia's nongame species including those which are endangered.

In the past the Georgia Ornithological Society has fought strongly for passage for a Nongame Tax Check-off Bill. This plan is not a tax, but a voluntary arrangement using the state income tax form as a mechanism for gathering funds.

Mr. Joe Frank Harris supported this plan in his campaign as a candidate for governor and now says he has encountered some problems with its passage in the State Legislature, involving cost to implement and legality under Georgia law.

While problems may appear in Georgia, 28 other states have managed to collect voluntary funds for nongame wildlife, including Louisiana, Alabama, and South Carolina. The State of Colorado, received \$552,000 in contributions during 1983, from over 10% of its taxpayers.

Up until 1980, funds for nongame species were provided by the Federal Government, under

the Endangered Species Act of 1973. There is a possibility that Georgia's new 1984 budget will contain funds for this program.

Regardless of how the funds are provided we all need to advise our Governor and key state officials of our concern for nongame species.



The nongame Tax Check-off now appears the best plan in the majority of states being less subject to political whims and philosophy.

Georgia's nongame fate seems to rest with us. We must speak up!

FROM THE EDITOR'S DESK

This past quarter brings us two birds not on the official/hypothetical lists for the state. A Baird's Sandpiper was watched in Laurens County and a Lesser Black-backed Gull was seen on Jekyll Island. These birds have been reported before in Georgia.

Two accidental birds - Audubon's and Cory's Shearwaters - appeared off Jekyll Island.

A Great Cormorant was found in Lee County for the first interior sighting to my knowledge. A Nashville Warbler was listed in December from Augusta for the first winter record to my knowledge.

Common Loons appeared off Buford Dam, Lakes Lanier and Chatuge, Sweetwater Creek State Park. Horned Grebes showed up at Sweetwater Creek State Park and Lakes Juliette and Chatuge.

February brought a sighting of a Green-backed Heron in Augusta. Glossy Ibis and Tundra Swans were also there. Greater Scaup and a White-winged Scoter came in from the Rum Creek Wildlife Management Area.

Bald Eagles were reported from Commerce Lake, Sweetwater Creek State Park, Jekyll Island, Lakes Juliette and Chatuge. A Golden Eagle sailed the sky over Crawford Country. Peregrine Falcons were viewed at Buford Dam, Atlanta, Dublin, Augusta, Lamar County, Jekyll Island.
