From the Editor's Desk

We had three birds reported for this issue that are not on the official or hypothetical lists for Georgia. These were: a Masked Booby found dead on Cumberland Island, a Varied Thrush seen in Murray County and an American Tree Sparrow from Blairsville.

One hypothetical list bird, a Franklin's Gull, was reported at Lake Hartwell.

Interesting sightings from around the state: Horned Grebe - Plant Scherer, Clark Hill Reservoir, Sweetwater Creek State Park. Roseate Spoonbill from Andrews Island. Wood Storks reported on Sapelo Island. A Tundra Swan at Dublin and at Banks County.

Greater Scaup held forth at Macon, Clayton County Water Treatment Plant, Cumberland, Sapelo and Tybee Islands. A Black Scoter and a White-winged Scoter were at Macon, as was a Black-bellied Plover. Lesser Golden Plover were at Dublin, Atlanta, Gainesville; while Wilson's Plovers were at Lake Juliette, Plant Scherer, Jekyll Island.

Black-necked Stilts were viewed on Jekyll and Andrews Islands. White-rumped Sandpipers were found in Murray County and Peachtree City Lake, and Red-necked Phalarope made news in Murray County. A Gull-billed Tern was on Cumberland Island and a Sandwich Tern was at Tybee Island.

An Olive-sided Flycatcher turned up in Murray County and Yellow-bellied Flycatcher at Watkinsville. A Warbling Vireo was at Atlanta; Connecticut Warblers were at Jekyll Island, Atlanta, Athens. A Snow Bunting was on Cumberland Island last winter.

The only active Bald Eagle nest in the interior of Georgia (one of only four in the state) is located on Mercer University property just south of Macon. Known to have produced young the last three years, one eaglet was raised last year and one chick is on the nest now (May). John Wilson, local artist and environmental activist is concerned that Mercer's plans for the land may be incompatible with the continued eagle habitation. Trees have been marked in the swamp near the nest, presumably for timbering. There has been talk of marketing the land for development. In order to raise public awareness of this perceived threat, John is forming an Environmental Alliance for Central Georgia.
