# From the Editor's Desk

We have two birds sighted this quarter that are not on the Checklist List, Provisional List or the Hypothetical List for our state. The two birds are a Common Eider seen at Savannah Beach and a McGillivray's Warbler caught in the nets at the Jekyll Island Banding Station.

Two Hypothetical List birds were turned in: Curlew Sandpiper from Cabretta Island and Ringed Turtle-dove from LaGrange.

Interesting birds from around the state include Eared Grebe from Plant Scherer, Audubon's Shearwater out of Jekyll Island. An American White Pelican was turned in from Macon; while a Glossy Ibis was viewed at Augusta.

A Roseate Spoonbill report came in from Brunswick and a Rough-legged Hawk soared over Stephens County. A Golden Eagle was found at Little Ocmulgee State Park and a Rufous Hummingbird appeared at Dalton. A Kirtland's Warbler was reported from Cumberland Island; however, this was a 1986 sighting, just now being received. Lincoln's Sparrows were reported from Murray County, Pendergrass and Roswell. Red Crossbills have once again turned up on the Chattahoochee National Forest and at Blue Ridge.

ABSTRACT OF THE MINUTES OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE AND BUSINESS MEETINGS OF THE GEORGIA ORNITHOLOGICAL SOCIETY (October 17, 1987)

Elections. Elections were held at the general business meeting. The new officers are as follows: President, Don Duncan; First Vice President, Branch Howe; Second Vice President, Ken George; Secretary, Helen Ogren; and Treasurer, John Swiderski. The full Executive Committee now includes Tommy Patterson and Bob Manns (past presidents), Frank McCamey and Ron Pulliam (members-at-large), Terry Moore and Harriett DiGioia (editors), Carolina Lane (business manager), and the five officers named above.

Appointments and resignations. Jack Cooper has been appointed to the Earle Greene Award Committee. He replaces Elbridge Freeborn, deceased. Chris Haney has relocated to Alaska and Mark Oberle has gone to Seattle, Washington for one to three years. Both have resigned from the Checklist Committee. Don Duncan has appointed Emil Urban to the Checklist Committee and Didi Manns to the Editorial Committee. The Executive Committee voted to appoint a committee to look into the Golden Eagle Reintroduction Program in Georgia since one of the members contends it never bred here and, therefore, cannot be reintroduced.

Limited Edition Print. The prints of the Orchard Oriole are on their way to Dr. Peterson for signing. Orders are being taken and will be filled as soon as the signed print is available. The Executive Committee voted to donate 25% of the net profits from the print to the Roger Tory Peterson Institute in appreciation of Peterson doing the painting, giving it to us, and allowing the limited edition print.

<u>Publications</u>. Terry Moore announced the June/September 1986 issue of <u>The Oriole</u> is at the printers and he hopes for distribution in December. He is currently working on the December 1986 issue, and the lag time is one year. The Executive Committee has decided to revise <u>A Birder's Guide to Georgia</u> rather than reprint the current edition.

Earle Greene Award. The Earle R. Greene Award was presented to T. MacRae Williams in absentia. Through his efforts, GOS has received recognition throughout the world; The Oriole is available in many international library collections. Dick Parks, Chairman of the Award Committee mentioned Williams' long-term, significant contributions to the GOS.

Actions and reports. A resolution against extending the Bobby Jones Expressway through the Merry Brothers Brickyard Ponds in Augusta, GA, was passed by the general membership and sent to the EPA, DOT, Senators Nunn and Fowler, Representative Barnard, and the Mayor of Augusta. The general membership voted to increase library dues from \$10 to \$12 per year. Don Cohrs gave a report on the ten years the Jekyll Island Banding Station has been in existence and made an appeal for a one time fund to help finance the station's advance expenses; it would be replenished annually by banders' rental fees and the sale of T-shirts. A report will be presented at the next Executive Committee meeting.

Thanks. Thanks were expressed to Georgine Pindar for her continuing efforts in the conservation area, Bob Raymund for all the work in setting up the current meeting, Dick Parks for getting Peterson to do the painting of the Orchard Oriole, and getting him to donate the painting to GOS and obtaining the permission for the limited edition print.

Future meetings. The Spring meeting will be hosted by the Elachee Nature Center in Gainesville, GA, April 29-May 1. The Fall meeting will be at Epworth-by-the-Sea on St. Simons Island, October 7-9, 1988.

## News of People

Frank DiGioia died on September 3, 1987. He had multiple myeloma - a form of cancer - for 22-1/2 years.

Travellers: Jack and Ruth Cooper made a birding trip to Grand Isle, LA. Best birds: Couch/Tropical Kingbird, Peregrine Falcon, Upland Plover.

Jeannine Angerman has been on the move. She went with Joe Greenberg on a trip to South Texas and added 50 birds to her Life List, including Golden-cheeked Warbler, Attwater Prairie Chicken, Whooping Crane. She also enjoyed a three week trip to Hawaii to the islands of Hawaii, Oahu, Maui, Kawai.

Al Jenkins explored Chile recently; while Johnny Parks and David Chaffin had a successful trip to Muscatatuck National Wildlife Refuge in southern Indiana where they saw Bell's Vireo and Henslow's Sparrow in a total of 68 species in six hours. Don and Joyce Duncan spent 12 days in Southwest Texas, seeing 205 species of birds, including such rarities as Masked Duck, Clay-colored Robin, White collared Seedeater. Ty Ivey also spent a few days in Texas, logging 180 species. Arlene Clark spent a week in Oregon with a group organized by the Oregon Nature Conservancy and saw 188 species, of which 64 were Life List birds. These sightings ranged from Arctic Loons to Prairie Falcons.

T. P. Haines journeyed to Bermuda and viewed White-tailed Tropicbirds, Blue-faced Boobies. Arthur Green went out Colorado way. Brenda and Billy Dunbar visited southwest Arizona and saw Trogons, Northern Beardless Tyrannulet, Rose-throated Becards. Billy got 75 new species for his Life List and Brenda got a few more than that.

The Sunday Outdoors Page of <u>The Atlanta Journal/Constitution</u>, December 27, 1987, carried an article about the Atlanta Audubon Society's Christmas Bird count. Featured in the article and in a picture were Helen Ogren and Joel Volpi.

The Atlanta newspaper of October 24, 1987 picked up the story about the MacGillivray's Warbler that was banded on Jekyll Island. A picture of Don Cohrs was featured, as well as quoting him. Terry Moore received a very nice mention.
