

### GOS Bill Terrell Avian Conservation Grant 2025 - Report from Birds Georgia

Thanks to generous funding from the Bill Terrell Grant and subaward through Georgia DNR, Birds Georgia was able to monitor the newly created Cumberland Dividings Bird Island throughout the breeding season in 2025. Georgia DNR efforts through this grant were focused on restoring shell rakes for American Oystercatcher nesting.

Funding provided by GOS was used to purchase a kayak, lifejacket, and paddle, which allowed staff to access the Bird Island without a boat. Funding also covered time and mileage for the Coastal Conservation Coordinator to visit once weekly during the breeding season. Access was granted by the Church of Eleven22 at Cabin Bluff to launch from their dock, just 300 meters from the CI Bird Island.

Additionally, funds were used to purchase four Moultrie trail cameras and a subscription, which allowed constant monitoring of the breeding birds remotely - which allowed us to detect predation or disturbance as it was happening.

The Cumberland Dividings Bird Island was roped off by Georgia DNR staff and volunteers on May 2, 2025 and signs were removed on September 25, 2025. Black Skimmer decoys were added to aid in the recruitment of BLSK and audio lures were played when visiting.

Breeding species on the Bird Island included Least Tern, Black Skimmer, and Gull-billed Tern. American Oystercatchers were seen loafing on the Bird Island, but no nesting activity took place. Least Terns were successful in fledging approximately 16 young. Black Skimmers raised approximately 3 chicks to near fledging, but they were lost to predation. Gull-billed Terns nested and renested, but only 2 made it to hatching but were later predated, well before fledging.

The primary cause of failure at this colony was near constant predation pressure from a Great Horned Owl. It was seen on the remote cameras regularly predating young Least Terns and Black Skimmer chicks. The cause of failure for the Gull-billed Terns may also be attributed to the GHOW, but it was not confirmed on camera.

Over the 4 month period when breeding birds were present, 16 people landed on the island on 7 different trips (besides BG/GA DNR staff). Zero dogs were noted on the trail cameras over the breeding season.

High tides in September overwashed more than half of the newly formed Bird Island. All three species nested in the lower area and would have been at risk of overwash if the high tides had happened earlier in the season. Fortunately, the birds had completed nesting attempts by September and were not affected.

An eBird Hotspot: <a href="https://ebird.org/hotspot/L43707625">https://ebird.org/hotspot/L43707625</a> was created for ease of tracking. Data was collected on the Georgia DNR's FieldMaps app for colonial seabird nesting and updated weekly. See data below.

Overall, this colony shows great promise and the birds seem to be eager to utilize it. The owl should be removed in order for productivity to increase and the monitoring efforts should continue to be a priority at this site moving forward. Human disturbance was minimal but should be monitored.

Recommendations moving forward:

- Regular checks by law enforcement (in case of updated Bird Island Rule)
- Implement owl removal
- Continue to utilize trail cameras to monitor remotely
- Implement chick shelters, as there is no cover for predation or heat
- Continue to enhance dredge spoil islands and add bird islands through beneficial use of dredge material
- Educate the public on the importance of the Bird Island Rule and nesting seabirds and shorebird habitat






# Adults Present on Bird Island




# Gull-billed Terns


